What has 59 beads, traces its roots to 1206, and is used to recall important events and times of Jesus's life?

(Hint: The answer is written three times on this page in big letters.) The rosary is a string of beads divided into five groups of 10 beads by one bead, with a strand of five beads and a crucifix that hangs from the bottom of it. Each bead has prayers that go along with it. Catholics begin by holding the crucifix and silently praying the Apostles' Creed, then moving onto the bead above the crucifix to say an Our Father. Each group of 10 beads is a decade, and after each decade there is a time to focus on one of four mysteries — joyful, luminous, sorrowful and glorious, that recall important moments in Jesus' life (see box at left).

When an apparition of the Virgin Mary revealed the rosary to St. Dominic Guzman in the 13th century, she made 15 promises to those who faithfully recite the prayer, including reception of special graces and her protection. The rosary would be "powerful armor" against the devil, and it could be used to destroy vice, decrease sin, and cause virtue and good works to flourish.

St. Dominic used the rosary in Europe where many Catholics were illiterate and couldn't learn about their religion through books. Today, you can continue to use the rosary, especially as a family prayer. And October is a perfect time to start. On Oct. 7, the Church celebrates the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary.

HOW TO **RAY** THE

1. While holding the crucifix, make the sign of the cross and then recite the Apostles' Creed.

2. Recite the **Our Father** on the first large bead.

3. On each of the three small beads recite a Hail Mary for an increase of faith, hope and charity.

4. Recite the **Glory Be to the Father** on the next large bead.


5. Recall the first rosary mystery and recite the **Our Father** on the next large bead. As a general rule, depending on the season, the joyful mysteries are said on Monday and Saturday; the sorrowroful mysteries on Tuesday and Friday; the glorious on Wednesday and Sunday, and the luminous mysteries on Thursday.

6. On each of the adjacent 10 small beads (also referred to as a decade) recite a Hail Mary while reflecting on the mystery.

7. On the next large bead, recite the Glory Be to the Father.

8. Each succeeding decade is prayed in a similar manner by recalling the appropriate mystery, reciting the Our Father, 10 Hail Marys, the Glory Be to the Father, while reflecting on the mystery.

9. When the fifth mystery is completed, the rosary is customarily concluded with the Hail, Holy Queen.
