

THE VOCATION CUP

Many families have precious keepsakes that remind them of their past and also of their future. Over the past few years it has become common once again for religious symbols to be part of our Catholic homes. These precious symbols are reminders of who we are as Catholics and what we are called to be. The Vocation Blessing Cup could be a wonderful instrument of prayer and devotion for our parish families. The Cup reminds each host family that it is their responsibility to pray for and foster vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

The Vocation Blessing Cup is to be used in the same fashion as the Pilgrim Virgin Statue of Fatima. A family is asked to host the Blessing Cup for one week. Each evening as the family gathers for their evening meal, the Blessing Cup would be placed at the center of the table to be used as a reminder of their commitment to pray for vocations. Each parish can have its own cup - and it would travel from host family to host family. In this way at least one family is praying for the intention of an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life. This special intention would be focused for a generous response to the call to priesthood and religious life from your parish.

At the beginning of the family meal fill the cup with your favorite beverage.
All make the Sign of the Cross.
A reading from Holy Scripture is proclaimed by a member of the family.
Intercessions are prayed and each family member may add their own intentions.
A closing prayer is said.
The Vocation Blessing Cup is then passed to each member of the family as a sign of the oneness of our prayer.
The prayer is ended with Grace Before Meals.
