Request for Financial Assistance for a parish in Southeastern Africa

"St. Mary's Parish in the Diocese of Karonga, Malawi, South Eastern Africa is in dire need of vestments and vessels for liturgical celebrations. In December 2009, the area experienced a series of earthquakes which destroyed many houses, four lives lost, and many people injured. The parish church was also destroyed, including some property like vestments and vessels. With financial assistance from Propanda Fide, Church in Need, Missio Aachen, Diocese of Des Moines in USA and Sisters of St. Peter Claver, the parish community along with Fr. Joseph Sikwese, Pastor of St. Mary's Parish, have constructed a new Church which was dedicated on October 6, 2018. However, the main challenge is that the parish does not have vestments and vessels for the celebration of the Eucharist among other liturgical celebrations. At the moment, they use borrowed vessels and vestments for resident priests. The parish community strongly believes that the parish needs to have its own vessels and vestments and will be grateful for any financial assistance." For more information contact Fr. United States Census 2020

The Archdiocese of Miami is working with the U.S. Census Bureau and the Miami-Dade Census Task Force to ensure that everyone in our community gets counted. Census forms will begin arriving in people's homes the first week of March and we would like your assistance in informing parishioners of the importance of being counted.

All census responses are confidential. There are very strict laws protecting the privacy of everyone who participates in the Census and everyone can participate, regardless of their immigration status.

A direct link to the Census home page, Parish and School resource link is available on the Archdiocese of Miami website www.miamiarch.org.

Pastors, please note: "The 2020 Census includes people who live or stay in group quarters, such as college or university residence halls, nursing/skilled-nursing facilities, group homes, residential treatment centers, workers' group living quarters, and correctional facilities." This includes all those living in rectories.

“A Census Bureau worker will contact you between February 3, 2020 and March 6, 2020 to conduct a telephone or in-person interview to:

- Verify the group quarters’ name, address information, contact name, phone number, and business email address.
- Collect an expected population count on April 1, 2020.
- Allow facility managers to choose a method of enumeration from those available to their group quarters, such as: in-person interview, drop off/pick up of questionnaire, paper response data collection, and electronic response data transfer (eResponse).
- Schedule an enumeration appointment.”

“Is My Email in Your Spam?”

There are multiple reasons why some important emails end-up in your spam folder, but the most common reasons have to do with the fact that:

- 1) Webmail providers (i.e. AOL, Gmail, Yahoo, etc.) investigate how many emails are opened and how many are deleted without being opened. This helps webmail providers decide which emails to filter into the spam folder.
- 2) You have low mailbox usage. Webmail providers look at the ratio of active to inactive email accounts. An inactive email account is an account that has not been used for a long time or is rarely used. If an email is sent to an email address that appears to be abandoned, that is a red flag to spam filters. It is advised to clean-up your email list periodically.
- 3) Unfortunately, some e-mail services view valid group e-mails as if they are SPAM.
- 4) Periodically, view the mail in your SPAM and JUNK folders before deleting.

In order to move important emails from the SPAM/JUNK folder to the INBOX folder, the user must **left-click and hold** the desired email in the SPAM /JUNK folder and drag it to the INBOX folder. This will allow you to open it in your INBOX and respond accordingly.

In order to prevent important emails from going into your SPAM /JUNK folder in the future, the user should **right-click** on the desired email in the SPAM /JUNK folder and select from whatever options the e-mail software provides. Usually there will be an option to mark the sender's address so that it will not be captured in the SPAM filter in the future. Selecting "Do not block this sender" or an equivalent option will assure that the sender's mail will arrive in the INBOX in the future.
