Boy Scouts of America

The Archdiocese of Miami has a long history of supporting the Boy Scouts of America program as an integral part of our parish's Youth Ministries. As I am sure you have read, the national Boy Scout organization has filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection because of many past claims of abuse. There have been no claims of abuse brought in connection with any scouting unit chartered by an ADOM entity. The BSA bankruptcy case is ongoing and complicated and is being monitored by our attorneys and the Florida Conference of Catholic Bishops. In the meantime, we will continue to support those BSA units, both Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts that are already chartered in our parishes. However, for the time being, no new BSA units are to be chartered at any ADOM parish or school.

It is again time for counting and reporting the weekly Mass census for the weekends in October. The 2021 October Mass Attendance Census includes the 5 weekends of October, beginning with the weekend of Saturday-Sunday, October 2-3, and ending October 30-31.

Please remember **to count the number of penitents** during these five weekends.

The deadline to return the count electronically is **Monday, November 15, 2021**. Thank you, in advance, for timely reporting – by electronic upload – of the data. New Online Training Option in the Virtus Registration Process

In these extraordinary times, the Safe Environment Office has reviewed the current process of Virtus training and how it should proceed in an effort to still provide quality education of awareness and prevention of child sexual abuse and do so in a safe and logistically viable procedure.

In response we have worked with Virtus National to provide temporary online training as an option. It is available in English, Spanish and also Korean and Vietnamese subtitles.

This means the participant must have access to the internet. For those few who do not, and do not have another option, then their site—meaning parish or school—is to provide them with a computer on site for them to complete this training.

All those completing the online training option will have an active Virtus account and will be required to read their monthly bulletins just as is required with the live training. The Local Coordinator at each site will have access to all accounts affiliated with their location just as before. Compliance responsibilities will not change.

Vocations Awareness Week

On the first full week of November, the USCCB asks us to celebrate vocations. Throughout the next few weeks, Fr. Labouré Society Seminarians

Dear brothers in the presbyterate, the Archdiocese of Miami currently has two men participating in the Labouré Society program. This program helps to remove the obstacle of student loan debt during the years of formation.

According to the National Religious Vocation Conference, of the approximately 10,000 men and women discerning a call each year to the priesthood or religious life, 42% of them are blocked due to student loan debt.

Since 2003, this 501(c)(3) organization has helped deliver over 300 men and women into religious formation who otherwise would have been turned away or put on hold due to student loans.

For the past year, pastor-appointed parish leaders and core teams have participated in monthly *Walking with Moms* webinars, completed inventories and assessments of local resources, visited their assigned Respect Life Pregnancy Help Center locations, created and implemented Parish Action Plans, and are currently submitting their results which we'll celebrate in Phase Seven at the *Congreso Pro Vida*. Unaccompanied Refugee Minors Program is looking for adults to become foster parents to refugee minors. The requirements to be a foster parent include:




- Be at least 21 years old
- Be able to provide adequate bedroom space and a separate bed for each foster child
- Have reliable transportation
- Be willing to participate in a 30-hour free training
- Be prepared for adults in your household to undergo complete background checks
- Be able to meet basic resources to support the household.
