# Requiescat in pace

- † **Deacon Rafael de los Reyes**, the first and longest-serving permanent deacon of the Archdiocese of Miami, died July 22, 2025 at 86 years old. He served in the Apostolate of Divine Mercy, the Charismatic Renewal, Camino del Matrimonio, and Radio Paz. His funeral Mass was celebrated at St. Augustine Parish in Coral Gables on July 25.
- † **Laverna Holtkamp Larson**, mother of Safe Environment Coordinator Jan Rayburn, died July 13, 2025 in Iowa at age 99. Her funeral Mass was celebrated July 23 in Iowa City.
- † **Sister Mary Alexius Murray** died July 20, 2025 at age 99. She served as a nurse at Mercy Hospital in Miami and celebrated 75 years as a Sister of St. Joseph last year.
- † **John Marino**, husband of St. Jerome School principal Tara Marino died recently overnight from a medical issue. Mr. Marino was a lieutenant in the Hollywood Police Department and served in law enforcement for nearly 29 years.

# **Priestly faculties in Ireland**

The Archbishop of Dublin, Ireland, has asked the USCCB to inform local U.S. bishops that any priest who travels to Ireland and seeks to exercise public ministry (as a resident or visitor) needs to be vetted and cleared by the Irish Police first. This requirement is in addition to their bishop's testimonial letter. It is important that at least one month's notice be given for this clearance to come through. To initiate this process of police clearance, it is best to make contact with the Irish diocese in which they hope to minister publicly.

Carmelo González González, a priest of the Diocese of Tenerife, Canary Islands, Spain, was recently reported to the Archdiocese of Miami as offering his services to various unsuspecting parishioners within our territory. Please note that Rev. Carmelo González González is not a priest in good standing according to his own diocese and certainly does not have authorization (faculties) to work in the Archdiocese of Miami. Kindly, be on alert about his whereabouts and report them when known. Obviously, please do not engage him in any ministerial activities and warn your parishioners about him.

# Office of Safe Environment

#### Safe Environment Local Coordinator

The Archdiocese of Miami's administration has reevaluated the Safe Environment Office in all aspects including the general policy, staffing and assigning of responsibilities, reporting procedures, requirements to serve as either an employee, vendor, or volunteer, and compliance procedures all in accordance with the USCCB's Charter for the Protection of Children and Vulnerable Adults.

An imperative part of ensuring compliance for our entities is the assigning of a Local Coordinator for your site. The Local Coordinator is responsible for compliance and record keeping of the Archdiocesan Creating and Maintaining Safe Environments for Children and Vulnerable Adults Policy. Essentially, this means ensuring that compliance is met and that it can be proven. (Remember the SE Office is an independently audited office.)

The role description is extensive and requires training before access is given. If your site does not have a local coordinator, please contact the Safe Environment office at <a href="mailto:jrayburn@theadom.org">jrayburn@theadom.org</a> for the Role Description, and consider your choice carefully. Once a candidate is identified, contact the Safe Environment Office with the name and email address of the candidate to receive the appropriate training. This person must already be compliant in Virtus, fingerprinting, and a signed pledge to promote safe environment.

Ultimately, the responsibility falls to the Pastor, Principal, or Director of the site. Thank you for joining the archdiocesan efforts to protect children and vulnerable adults.
